137.01 GIFTS, GRANTS, BEQUESTS, AND DIVISES.

Because the "rights, immunities, franchises and endowments" granted to the university by Laws 1851, Chapter 3, were "perpetuated unto" the university, Laws 1925, Chapter 426, was unconstitutional, and it was held in respect to control of university finances the commission of administration and finance had no control. *University v Chase*, 175 M 259, 220 NW 951; *Fanning v University*, 183 M 222, 236 NW 217.

If it be assumed that under the supposed law of its being, Laws 1851, Chapter 3, the organization of the University of Minnesota was defective, or even invalid, and hence there was no corporation de facto, it became a corporation de jure by the constitutional confirmation of the "existing laws" under which it was organized and functioning when Minnesota Constitution, Article 8, Section 4, was adopted. *State ex rel v Quinlivan*, 198 M 65, 268 NW 858.

The University is not subject to certain rules of the war food administration. OAG June 22, 1944 (618c-20).

The president of the university not being an employee of the state, may accept a fee for delivering the commencement address at Mankato Teachers College. OAG July 25, 1944 (618a-14).
