350.01 AMOUNT. Subdivision 1. When paid. The yearly salaries of the state officers and employees mentioned in this chapter shall be as herein fixed and all salaries shall be payable in semimonthly instalments.

Subdivision 2. Compensation for services. All employees of the state shall receive compensation due them for services rendered semimonthly. This subdivision shall not apply to elective officers and heads of state departments who may be appointed thereto.

Subdivision 3. To be in full payment for services. The salaries provided in this chapter for the officers and employees named herein shall be in full payment for all services that may be rendered by them either in the performance of their regular or special duties or while acting as a member or employee of any state board or commission.

Subdivision 4. Fees collected paid into state treasury. All fees of any nature collected by any officer or employee named in this chapter shall be paid into the state treasury.

350.02 OFFICE OF GOVERNOR. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the governor shall be as follows:

Effective July 1, 1945

- (1) Governor, \$8,500;
- (2) Private secretary, \$5,000;
- (3) Executive clerk, \$3,000;
- (4) Recording clerk, who shall also be clerk of the pardon board, \$2,000;
- (5) Executive messenger, \$2,000;
- (6) Assistant executive messenger, \$1,200;
- 7) Notary clerk and stenographer, \$1,800.

350.03 OFFICE OF SECRETARY OF STATE. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the secretary of state shall be as follows:

- (1) Secretary of state, \$4,500; provided, that out of the sums appropriated for the salaries and expense of the motor vehicle division for the year ending June 30, 1942, and for the year ending June 30, 1943, \$1,800 is for additional salary of the secretary of state for supervising the division;
 - (2) Assistant secretary of state, \$2,800;
 - (3) Chief clerk, \$3,000;
 - (4) Recording clerk, \$1,800;
 - (5) Assistant recording clerk, \$1,500;
 - (6) General clerk, \$1,200;
- (7) Clerk of government surveys and documents, shall receive an annual salary in such amount, not exceeding \$2,500, as the secretary of state shall fix;
 - (8) Stenographer, \$1,200.

350.04 OFFICE OF STATE AUDITOR. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the state auditor shall be as follows:

(1) State auditor, \$6,000;

- (2) Chief deputy auditor, \$4,500, out of the moneys appropriated for salaries for the year ending June 30, 1942, and for the year ending June 30, 1943, is for annual salary of the chief deputy auditor;
 - (3) Accountant, \$2,400;
 - (4) Warrant clerk, \$1,800;
 - (5) Clerk of investment board, \$1,800;
 - (6) Stenographer, \$1,200;
- (7) Additional clerks, such sum as the auditor shall prescribe not exceeding in all, \$13,740;
 - (8) Assistant land clerk, \$1,500;
- (9) Additional land clerks, such sum as the auditor shall prescribe not exceeding in all, \$5,400;
 - (10) Mineral land clerk, \$2,100.

350.05 OFFICE OF STATE TREASURER. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the state treasurer shall be as follows:

- (1) State treasurer, \$4,500; provided, that out of the moneys appropriated for salaries for the year ending June 30, 1942, and for the year ending June 30, 1943, \$1,500 is additional salary of the state treasurer;
- (2) Deputy state treasurer, \$3,000; provided, that out of the moneys appropriated for salaries for the year ending June 30, 1942, and for the year ending June 30, 1943, \$400.00 is for additional salary of the deputy state treasurer;
 - (3) Cashier, \$2,700;
 - (4) Investment clerk, \$2,100;
- (5) Assistant cashier, accountants, stenographers, and general clerks, such sum as the treasurer shall prescribe, not exceeding in all the amount appropriated by the legislature for such purpose.

350.06 OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the attorney general shall be as follows:

- (1) Attorney general, \$7,000;
- (2) Deputy attorney general, \$6,000;
- (3) Deputy attorney general, \$6,000;
- (4) Six assistant attorneys general, other than the assistant attorney general who is a member of the rural credit bureau, each \$5,000.

350.07 OFFICE OF STATE LIBRARIAN. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the state librarian shall be as follows:

- (1) State librarian, \$3,000;
- (2) Assistant state librarian, \$2,100;
- (3) Second assistant librarian, \$1,500;
- (4) Librarian's stenographer, \$1,200.

350.08 OFFICE OF RAILROAD AND .WAREHOUSE COMMISSION. The yearly salaries to be paid to officers and employees in the office of the railroad and warehouse commission shall be as follows:

- (1) Three railroad and warehouse commissioners, \$4,500 each; there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,500 for each of the years ending June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, out of the appropriation for the grain inspection division, which sum is to be used as additional salary for members of the railroad and warehouse commission.
- (2) From the moneys appropriated for salaries, there shall be available \$4,000 for each of the years ending June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, for the salary of an attorney, who shall be appointed by the attorney general, and that the sum of \$4,000 shall not be supplemented by any amount from any other fund of the railroad and warehouse commission.

350.09 SALARIES OF CERTAIN STATE OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES

350.09 SALARIES; OFFICE OF THE SUPREME COURT. The yearly salaries to be paid to the officers and employees in the office of the supreme court shall be as follows:

- (1) Chief justice, \$10,000;
- (2) Associate justices, \$9,500 each;
- (3) Clerk of the supreme court, \$4,500; provided, that of the moneys appropriated for salaries, \$500 is additional salary for each of the years ending June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, of the clerk of the supreme court;
- (4) Deputy clerk, \$3,000; provided, that of the moneys appropriated for salaries, \$400 is additional salary for each of the years ending June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, of the deputy clerk of the supreme court;
 - (5) Stenographer, \$1,500;
 - (6) Assistant clerk, \$1,500;
 - (7) Supreme court reporter, \$3,600;
- (8) Reporter's assistant, to be appointed by him and approved by the court, \$2,000:
 - (9) Marshal, \$1,500;
 - (10) Janitor, \$1,200;
- (11) Each stenographer, such sum as shall be fixed by the justice or court commissioner appointing them; not exceeding \$1,500.

350.10 SALARIES; JUDGES OF THE DISTRICT COURT. The yearly salaries to be paid to the judges of the district court shall be \$7,000 each from the state and \$1,500 additional, payable monthly, from each county in their respective districts having a population of 75,000 or more and \$300 additional in each judicial district having an area of more than 15,000 square miles, payable monthly, from the counties comprising such judicial district in such proportion as the assessed valuation of each county bears to the total assessed valuation of such judicial district in the preceding year; provided, that when any district judge shall preside upon the trial or hearing of any cause outside of his resident judicial district, wherein the district judge receives a larger salary, he shall receive as additional compensation during the period of such trial or hearing the difference between his fixed compensation and the compensation of the district judge of the district where he has been so engaged, the same to be paid by the county wherein the trial or hearing was held upon certification of the senior resident district judge thereof.

350.105 RETIREMENT COMPENSATION NOT INCREASED. The retirement compensation for justices of the supreme court and judges of the district court, now in effect, shall not be increased by reason of the change in salaries provided for in Laws 1945, chapter 507, but shall be governed by the provisions of law and based on salaries in force immediately prior to the passage thereof.

350.11 AUTO HIRE PAID TO CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES. The maximum amount which shall be paid by the state, any department or bureau thereof, or any county, city, village, town, or school district, to any officer or employee, except sheriffs or deputy sheriffs, as compensation or reimbursement for the use by such officer or employee of his own automobile in the performance of his duties shall not exceed five cents per mile. In case of sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, the maximum amount so to be paid shall not exceed seven cents per mile.

This section shall be construed as amending all existing laws authorizing such allowances or reimbursements by imposing the maximum limit above set forth and shall not be construed as permitting the payment of such allowance or the making of such reimbursement to any officer or employee where it is not now permitted or hereafter authorized by law or by authority of the governing body of any municipality above named or by any commission or board of any county.
