

CHAPTER 141

PRIVATE TRADE SCHOOLS

141.01 DEFINITIONS.

A school which charges pupils the cost of materials and laboratory tests only and makes no charge for instruction is a "private trade school." OAG Dec. 14, 1943 (170-I).

141.04 LICENSE.

An applicant who gives ground and flying instruction should be licensed by the commissioner of aeronautics and not by the commissioner of education as a trade school. OAG April 26, 1944 (170-I); OAG June 26, 1944 (170-I).

Where instructions are given by a sewing machine agency to purchasing customers, a license is not required. OAG Oct. 29, 1945 (170-i).

141.06 PERMITS FOR SOLICITORS.

The permits granted to public trade school solicitors are for a calendar year. OAG Jan. 4, 1944 (170-I).

Sections 141.06 and 141.11 are independent of each other and operated separately. Each requires a bond. The permits reach different objects. Each requires approval by the commissioner. Contracts must contain liquidation clause approved by the commissioner. OAG July 31, 1946 (170-i).
