643.29 DIMINUTION OF SENTENCE

Diminution of sentence; good conduct time allowance. 33 MLR 40.

Where a person is sentenced to a term of 10 days and another term of 20 days, to be served consecutively, the 30 days on the two charges is entitled to the same diminution as if it were one sentence of 30 days. OAG March 24, 1949 (341-K-1).

Where a prisoner was sentenced by the judge of the district court to a sentence of six months in jail, plus a \$500 fine, and provided that upon paying the \$500 he might be released on probation at the end of two months, upon his serving 50 days and having paid the \$500 fine, he could not be released because his good-behaviour diminution of sentence is measured by the term of his sentence. He can only be released at the end of the two month term. OAG Feb. 10, 1953 (341-F).
