82.22 Examinations.

Subdivision 1. **Generally.** Each applicant for a license must pass an examination conducted by the commissioner. The examinations shall be of sufficient scope to establish the competency of the applicant to act as a real estate broker or as a real estate salesperson.

84.028 Commissioner of natural resources, specific assignments.

Subdivision 1. The powers, duties and responsibilities of the department of natural resources relating to boat safety, firearm safety, wild rice harvest program, ginseng harvest program, and such other programs as are now or hereafter vested by statute in the department of natural resources, shall be under the control and supervision of the commissioner of natural resources.

84.524 Citizen's advisory task force on the boundary waters canoe area.

Subdivision 1. There is created a citizen's advisory task force on the Boundary Waters Canoe Area, consisting of 17 members selected as follows:

- (1) Three residents of St. Louis County appointed by the governor;
- (2) Three residents of Cook County appointed by the governor;
- (3) Three residents of Lake County appointed by the governor; and
- (4) Eight residents of the state residing outside of the aforementioned counties appointed by the governor.

The governor shall designate one of the appointees to serve as chairman and the advisory task force may elect such other officers as it deems necessary. The advisory task force shall be subject to the provisions of section 15.059, except that the advisory task force shall not expire until June 30, 1983.

Subd. 2. The advisory task force shall conduct meetings and research into all matters related to the establishment and operation of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area, and shall make such recommendations to the United States Forest Service and other federal and state agencies concerned, regarding operation of the area, as the advisory task force

deems advisable. A copy of each recommendation shall be filed with the legislative reference library. The advisory task force shall not apply for or accept funds from public or private sources other than the legislature. Subject to the availability of legislative appropriation, the advisory task force may contract for services relating to matters within its authority.

Subd. 3. The sum of \$60,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of administration for the purposes of Laws 1979, Chapter 301 to be available until June 30, 1981.

Subd. 4. This section is effective July 1, 1979, and expires June 30, 1983. [1979 c 301 s 11]

84.64 Conservation restrictions.

Subdivision 1. A conservation restriction for a definite period or in perpetuity may be acquired by:

- (a) The commissioner of natural resources, in the name of the state, by gift, purchase or exchange, with funds specifically made available for that purpose;
- (b) A nonprofit charitable corporation whose purposes include conservation of land or water areas; or
 - (c) A home rule charter or statutory city.

84.65 Conservation restrictions; effect of recording; release of restrictions; enforcement.

Subdivision 1. No conservation restriction defined in section 84.64 and acquired pursuant to section 84.64, subdivision 1, shall be unenforceable on account of lack of privity of estate or contract or lack of benefit to particular land. Nonprofit charitable corporations or home rule charter or statutory cities acquiring such conservation restrictions shall file a notice of each such acquisition with the department of natural resources within 90 days. All restrictions shall be duly recorded and indexed in the office of the county recorder or the registrar of titles for the county where the land lies so as to affect its title, in the manner of other conveyances of interests in land, and shall describe the land subject to the restrictions by adequate legal description or by reference to a recorded plat showing its boundaries.

84.82 Snowmobile registration.

- Subd. 6. **Exemptions.** No registration hereunder shall be required for the following described snowmobiles:
- (a) Snowmobiles owned and used by the United States, another state, or a political subdivision thereof.
- (b) Snowmobiles registered in a country other than the United States temporarily used within this state.
- (c) Snowmobiles covered by a valid license of another state and which have not been within this state for more than 30 consecutive days.
 - (d) Snowmobiles used exclusively in organized track racing events.
