**214.04 SERVICES.**

Subdivision 1. The commissioner of administration with respect to the board of electricity, the commissioner of education with respect to the board of teaching, the commissioner of public safety with respect to the board of private detective and protective agent services, and the board of peace officer standards and training, and the commissioner of revenue with respect to the board of assessors, shall provide suitable offices and other space, joint conference and hearing facilities, examination rooms, and the following administrative support services: purchasing service, accounting service, advisory personnel services, consulting services relating to evaluation procedures and techniques, data processing, duplicating, mailing services, automated printing of license renewals, and such other similar services of a housekeeping nature as are generally available to other agencies of state government. Investigative services shall be provided the boards by employees of the office of attorney general. The commissioner of health with respect to the health related licensing boards and the chairman of the commerce commission with respect to the remaining nonhealth related licensing boards shall provide the above facilities and services at a central location for the health related and remaining nonhealth related licensing boards. The legal and investigative services for the boards shall be provided by employees of the attorney general assigned to the departments servicing the boards. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the attorney general shall not be precluded by this section from assigning other attorneys to service a board if necessary in order to insure competent and consistent legal representation. Persons providing legal and investigative services shall to the extent practicable provide the services on a regular basis to the same board or boards.

**214.06 FEES; LICENSE RENEWALS.**

Subdivision 1. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the commissioner of health as authorized by section 214.13, all health related licensing boards and all nonhealth related licensing boards shall by rule, with the approval of the commissioner of finance, adjust any fee which the board is empowered to assess a sufficient amount so that the total fees collected by each board will as closely as possible equal anticipated expenditures during the fiscal biennium, as provided in section 16A.128. All fees received shall be deposited with the state treasurer and credited to the general fund.

**214.13 HUMAN SERVICES OCCUPATIONS.**

Subd. 4. The commissioner of health shall wherever possible delegate the administration of regulation activities to a health related licensing board with the concurrence of that board. If the commissioner of health delegates this function, the licensing board shall regularly bill the commissioner of health for the cost of performing this function. The commissioner of health may establish an advisory task force to advise him or the appropriate health related licensing board on matters relating to the registration and regulation of an occupation. A task force shall have seven members appointed by the commissioner of which five are members of the registered occupation or related registered or licensed occupations, and two are public members. A task force shall expire, and the terms, compensation and removal of members shall be as provided in section 15.059.

NOTE: Subdivision 1 was amended by Laws 1983, chapter 289, section 102, to read as follows:

"Subdivision 1. There is established a human services occupations advisory council to assist the commissioner of health in formulating policies and rules according to section 214.13. The commissioner shall determine the duties of the council, shall establish procedures for the proper functioning of the council including, but not limited to the following: the method of selection of membership, the selection of a committee chairman and methods of communicating recommendations and advice to the commissioner for his consideration. Each of the health related licensing boards, the state examining committee for physical therapists, the state comprehensive health planning advisory council and the higher education coordinating board shall have a representative selected by the boards, committee, or council. The governor shall appoint the remaining members who shall not exceed 11 and shall include six persons broadly representative of human services, particularly human services professions not presently credentialed according to existing law, and five public members. The committee shall expire and the terms of the appointed members and the compensation and removal of all members shall be as provided in section 15.059."
