4 limited, or who dishonestly or unfaithfully discharges any
 5 of his duties as notary public, shall on complaint filed and C. S. p. 135, Sect. 99. c 5
 6 substantiated in like manner as other cases, in the district
 7 court of the county in which he resides, be removed from
 8 his said office by such court; and the court shall thereupon
 9 certify the fact of such removal to the governor, and the
 10 party so removed shall be thereafter ineligible to a reap-
 11 pointment to the office of notary public in this state.

CHAPTER XXVII.

REPORTER OF SUPREME COURT.

1 SECTION 1. The reporter of the supreme court shall take 1865—p. 76, Sect. 1. c 34
 2 the oath required by law, and shall execute a bond to be
 3 approved by the governor in the sum of five hundred dol-
 4 lars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties
 5 of his office.

1 SECT. 2. The reporter shall make careful and accurate
 2 reports of all cases argued and decided by the supreme 1865—p. 77, Sect. 2. c 34
 3 court. He shall be entitled to the possession of the origi-
 4 nal files in all cases for a reasonable time, to prepare copies Amended.
 5 for publication, and shall report the cases more or less at
 6 large, according to their relative importance. The report
 7 of each case shall contain concise notes of the points deci-
 8 ded, a statement of the facts taken from the record, when
 9 the same are not fully given in the opinion of the court,
 10 the names of the counsel with the points made and authori-
 11 ties cited, (more or less at length in the discretion of the
 12 reporter) and the opinion of the court. He shall publish a
 13 volume of such reports as often as there is sufficient matter
 14 to form a volume of not less than six hundred pages. All
 15 volumes hereafter published shall bear the uniform title of
 16 "Minnesota Reports."

1 SECT. 3. The reporter of each volume shall print and 1865—p. 77, Sect. 3. c 34
 2 bind the same at his own expense, he shall have and retain Amended.
 3 the exclusive copyright thereof as his own property, and
 4 the state shall purchase from him two hundred volumes of
 5 each edition, bound in the ordinary style of law reports, at
 6 the sum of six dollars per volume.

1 SECT. 4. Of the two hundred copies deposited with the 1865—p. 77, Sect. 4. c 34
 2 secretary of state; as above provided, the following state Amended.
 3 officers shall be entitled to one copy of each volume, to wit:

4 The several judges of the supreme and district courts, t e
5 attorney general, the judges of probate of the several coun-
6 ties. A sufficient number shall be sent as exchanges to
7 the several states of the union by the secretary, and the
8 balance deposited with the state librarian.

CHAPTER XXVIII.

AUCTIONEERS.

1 SECTION 1. The board of county commissioners may
2 license for the term of one year, one or more legal voters of
3 their county, to be auctioneers, and the person receiving
4 such appointment, shall pay to the county auditor, for the
5 use of said county, such sum annually, as said board re-
6 quire.

1 SECT. 2. No license shall take effect until the payment of
2 the sum fixed by said board as aforesaid. The county auditor
3 shall record every license granted, and forthwith pay over to
4 the treasurer of the county the amount so paid, taking
5 the treasurer's receipt therefor.

C. S. p. 852, Sect. 3.

1 SECT. 3. Each auctioneer, before making any sales as
2 auctioneer shall give a bond to the treasurer of the county
3 in which he resides, with sufficient sureties, to be approved
4 by the said treasurer, in such penal sum as the said treas-
5 urer requires, not less than one thousand dollars, nor more
6 than three thousand dollars; with condition to pay all auc-
7 tion duties required by law to the treasurer of the said
8 county, and also, that he will in all things well and truly
9 conform to the laws relating to auctioneers; which bond
10 shall be filed in the office of said treasurer, with the endorse-
11 ment of his approval thereon.

1 SECT. 4. If any person licensed as aforesaid, receives
2 for sale at auction, any goods, wares, merchandise, or per-
3 sonal property from any minor or servant, knowing him to
4 be such servant or minor, he shall forfeit a sum not ex-
5 ceeding two hundred dollars for each offense.

C. S. p. 853, Sect. 5.

1 SECT. 5. Every licensed auctioneer shall keep a fair and
2 particular account of all goods, chattels and property sold
3 by him, the names of the persons from whom the same were
4 received, and the names of the persons to whom the same
5 were sold.
