CHAPTER XXVIII.

AUCTIONEERS.

1 SECTION 1. The board of county commissioners may
 2 license for the term of one year, one or more legal voters of
 3 their county, to be auctioneers, and the person receiving
 4 such appointment, shall pay to the county auditor, for the
 5 use of said county, such sum annually, as said board re-
 6 quire.

1 SECT. 2. No license shall take effect until the payment of
 2 the sum fixed by said board as aforesaid. The county auditor
 3 shall record every license granted, and forthwith pay over to
 4 the treasurer of the county the amount so paid, taking
 5 the treasurer's receipt therefor.

1 SECT. 3. Each auctioneer, before making any sales as
 2 auctioneer shall give a bond to the treasurer of the county
 3 in which he resides, with sufficient sureties, to be approved
 4 by the said treasurer, in such penal sum as the said treas-
 5 urer requires, not less than one thousand dollars, nor more
 6 than three thousand dollars; with condition to pay all auc-
 7 tion duties required by law to the treasurer of the said
 8 county, and also; that he will in all things well and truly
 9 conform to the laws relating to auctioneers; which bond
 10 shall be filed in the office of said treasurer, with the endorse-
 11 ment of his approval thereon.

1 SECT. 4. If any person licensed as aforesaid, receives
 2 for sale at auction, any goods, wares, merchandise, or per-
 3 sonal property from any minor or servant, knowing him to
 4 be such servant or minor, he shall forfeit a sum not ex-
 5 ceeding two hundred dollars for each offense.

1 SECT. 5. Every licensed auctioneer shall keep a fair and
 2 particular account of all goods, chattels and property sold
 3 by him, the names of the persons from whom the same were
 4 received, and the names of the persons to whom the same
 5 were sold.

1 SECT. 6. If any person, not licensed, and qualified as an
 2 auctioneer, as prescribed in the preceding sections, sells or C. S. p. 353, Sect. 6.
 3 attempts to sell, any real or personal property at public
 4 auction, he is guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punish-
 5 ed by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, for each
 6 offense.

1 SECT. 7. The tenant or occupant of any house or store,
 2 having the actual possession and control of the same, who C. S. p. 353, Sect. 7.
 3 knowingly permits any person to sell any real or personal
 4 property at public auction in his said house or store, or in
 5 any apartment or yard appurtenant to the same, contrary to
 6 the provisions of this chapter, shall forfeit a sum not ex-
 7 ceeding one hundred dollars.

1 SECT. 8. Nothing in this chapter, shall extend to sales C. S. p. 353, Sect. 8.
 2 made by sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, coroners, constables, or
 3 collectors of taxes.

1 SECT. 9. No license granted as aforesaid, shall remain C. S. p. 353, Sect. 9.
 2 in force more than one year from the date thereof.

CHAPTER XXIX.

TOWN PLATS.

1 SECTION 1. When any person wishes to lay out a town
 2 or an addition or subdivision of out lots, he shall cause the C. S. p. 369, Sect. 1.
 3 same to be surveyed, and a plat thereof made, which shall
 4 particularly describe and set forth all the streets, alleys,
 5 commons or public grounds, and all in and out lots or frac-
 6 tional lots within, adjoining, or adjacent to said town, giv-
 7 ing the names, width, courses, boundaries and extent of all
 8 such streets and alleys.

1 SECT. 2. All the in lots shall be numbered in pro-
 2 gressive numbers, or by the squares in which they are sit-
 3 uated, and their precise length and width stated on said C. S. p. 370, Sect. 2.
 4 plat; and out lots shall not exceed ten acres in size, and
 5 shall in like manner be surveyed and numbered, and their
 6 precise length and width stated on the plat, together with
 7 any streets, alleys or roads which divide or border the
 8 same.

1 SECT. 3. The proprietor of the town, addition or subdi-
 2 vision of out lots, shall at the time of surveying and laying
