SECT. 81. If such judgment is not satisfied or proceed-2 ings thereon stayed by appeal or otherwise, before the next annual meeting of said school district, a certified copy of the docket of the judgment may be presented to said district at

5 its annual meeting.

The trustees of the district shall thereupon SECT. 82. cause the amount due on the judgment with interest from 1865-n. 26. Sect. 2. the date of its recovery to be added, to the tax of said dis-4 trict, and the same shall be certified to the county auditor.

and collected as other district taxes are collected.

SECT. 83. If such judgment is not paid within thirty days after the time fixed by law for the county treasurer to pay over the money in his hands, levied for the purpose of paying such judgment next after the rendition thereof, execution may be issued on such judgment but only the property belonging to said district, shall be liable thereon.

### CHAPTER XXXVII.

#### STATE NORMAL SCHOOL.

C. S. p. 353, Sect. 30. Amended.

C. S. p. 354, Sects. 33 & 34 combined & amended.

SECTION 1. There is established at Winona, in this 2 state, an institution to educate and prepare teachers for 3 teaching in the common schools of this state, called "The 4 State Normal School."

SECT. 2. The governor shall appoint six electors, one 2 from each judicial district, who shall constitute the state 3 normal board of instruction. Those appointed from the 4 even numbered judicial districts, shall hold their offices for 5 the term of four years, and those appointed from the odd numbered judicial districts shall hold their office for the term of two years. The normal board shall elect one of their number president, who shall continue in office for two years and until his successor is chosen, and they shall appoint some suitable person as treasurer, who shall hold his 11 office for one year, but may be removed at any time at the 12 pleasure of the board. The treasurer, before entering upon 13 the duties of his office, shall give bond to the state in the 14 penal sum of five thousand dollars, faithfully to execute 15 the trust and discharge the duties of his office. The state 16 superintendent of public instruction shall be ex officio a 17 member of the normal board, and shall be secretary of the 18 same.

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SECT. 3. The normal board are authorized and empow-2 ered to contract for the erection of all buildings connected 3 with the state normal school, to appoint all professors or 4 teachers in such institution, to prescribe the course of study 5 and the pre-requisites for admission, and in general to adopt 6 all needful rules for the government of said school.

The normal board are authorized annually to SECT. 4. 2 appoint for each normal school a prudential committee, con-c.s.p.334, Sect. 39. 3 sisting of three persons, one of whom shall be a member of 4 said board. Said prudential committee shall have the gen-5 eral oversight and management of the prudential affairs of 6 the state normal school, subject to the order of the board. 7 to whom they shall each make a detailed report of their do-

stuke out

8 ings and of the condition and wants of the particular insti-9 tution committed to their care.

SECT. 5. There shall be no charge for tuition to persons 2 who may be admitted to the privileges of the state normal C.S.p. 355, Sect. 40 3 school, and who shall engage to become teachers of the 4 public schools of the state for such times and on such con-

5 ditions as shall be prescribed by the normal board.

SECT. 6. The board, through the state superintendent, 2 shall make an annual and detailed report of their doings to 3 the governor, who shall transmit the same to the legisla-4 ture. They shall also report respecting the condition, suc-5 cess and progress of the state normal school.

SECT. 7. The normal directors, with the state superintendent shall be the special visitors of the normal school. 3 and they, together, or by one or more of their number, or 4 by some competent person or persons of their appointment, 5 shall visit and examine such school at least two days each 6 session, for ascertaining the mode of instruction and the 7 progress of the pupils, and for promoting the best welfare 8 of such institution and of the common schools of the state.
