## CHAPTER VII. SALARIES. <br> TITLE I. <br> OF STATE OFFICERS.

1 Section 1. The salary of the governor is two thousand dollars per annum.

The lieutenant governor receives six dollars per day dur4 i g the session of the legislature.
5 The salary of the secretary of state is twelve hundred dollars per annum.
The salary of the treasurer of state is one thousand dol8 lars per annum.
9 The salary of the auditor of state is twelve hundred dol10 lars per annum.

The clerks of the state land office receive a salary of six 32 hundred dollars per annum.
