738 AGAINST SOVEREIGNTY OF STATE. CHAP. XCIII.

CHAPTER XCIII.

OF OFFENSES AGAINST THE SOVEREIGNTY OF THE STATE.

- 1 Section 1. Treason against this state shall consist only in 2 levying war against the same, or in adhering to the enemies 3 thereof, giving them aid and comfort.
- New. 1 Sect. 2. Whoever commits treason against this state 2 shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for 3 life.
 - SECT. 3. Whoever, having knowledge of the commission of treason, conceals the same, and does not, as soon as may be, disclose and make known such treason to the governor or one of the judges of the supreme court, shall be adjudged guilty of the offense of misprison of treason and be punished by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment in the state prison not exceeding five years, or in the common jail not exceeding two years.
 - 1 Sect. 4. No person shall be convicted of treason but 2 by the testimony of two lawful witnesses to the same overt 3 act of treason whereof he stands indicted, unless he confess-4 es the same in open court.

1 Section 1. The killing of a human being, without the 2 authority of law, by poison, shooting, stabbing, or any oth-3 er means, or in any other manner, is either murder, man-4 slaughter, or excusable or justifiable homicide, according to 5 the facts and circumstances of each case.

1 SECT. 2. Such killing when perpetrated with a premed-2 itated design to effect the death of the person killed, or any 3 human being, shall be murder in the first degree, and who-4 ever is convicted of the same shall suffer the penalty of 5 death; but any person convicted of any capital crime shall
